This will be an open process professional discussion of the concepts and terminologies of cancer and how they can be rendered clearly into ASL. One goal is to develop a shared conceptual understanding of cancer, including cancer in general and how it works, how each cancer is different, tests used by oncologists, and various treatments. A second goal is to develop a shared interpreting repertoire and approach for DIs and HIs to team together to interpret an upcoming presentation to the Deaf community about cancer.

This workshop is intended for seasoned professionals. Newer interpreters are encouraged to attend and learn as much as possible, with deference given to the wisdom of Deaf, coda and veteran hearing interpreters. Deaf community members are welcome to advise on the clarity of interpretations. This workshop will be conducted in ASL only.
